The winner logged 170 AM stations received. It was a fun, interesting and educational contest. The contest in October was the "Sprint" event that took place over a long weekend. There is a longer contest coming up in January that is usually ten days long. Though the January dates have not been finalized by the Birmingham group yet, they should be posted shortly. From comments heard on our club frequency, we may have Bill, W2ZKE, James, and I entering in the January contest, so if you have interest, there are members who can help with any questions you have. Please consider entering even if you aren't a contester. The contest is really just a catalyst to get people to put something together and see how impressive an un-amplified receiver can be.

# Field Trip to Info Age/Marconi Radio Site

On Saturday, November 10, at 8:30 am, we are gathering at the northwest corner (near Chen's) to carpool/caravan to the Info Age site in Wall Township, NJ. We should arrive at Info Age by about 10 am. Return time is to be determined by how long people want to stay.

This is the location of the Marconi Radio Company (later RCA and military groups) overseas radio communications station in the early part of the 20th century. Now at this site are: a rather extensive radio history museum; the "hotel" in which the Marconi company radio operators lived; the Diana radar site (first? moon radar reflection); a collection of military vehicles; an Amateur Radio club (not sure which); a marine disaster display (may not be open); and various other interesting things. I have been told that just to spend 30 seconds at each exhibit in the radio museum would take 2 hours. There is no official sequence planned for this visit, although I have been told that going through the museum at a brisk pace, then seeing some of the other "attractions" and returning to the museum for those who want a closer look may be the best way to allot time.

There is no food facility within the site. There is a limited supply of soft drinks @ \$1, but don't count on it. Pack a snack or lunch, or do lunch later on your way back.

The site is located at 2201 Marconi Drive, Wall Township, NJ for those who want to check out google maps. This is not far from exit 7A on Route 18. The suggested route is to take the Parkway south to Route 18 (which looks like a fairly complex transition), thence to exit 7A on Route 18, and then local roads. I will endeavor to send out more precise directions. I plan to drive and have room for 3 others (4 in a pinch). Perhaps we should ask for those willing to drive to send a message to the e-mail reflector, and indicate if they have a time at which they must return.

I hope a lot of NPARCers will take advantage of this trip.
